





A Day at the Fair


These beautiful antiques and collectibles from the collection of Ruth Doyle and Miles Hartung are on display at the Senior Center. All items have been entered in past Natrona County Fairs, many receiving award ribbons. Ruth and Miles are past officers and long-time members of the Casper Antique Collectibles Club. Note the purple Grand Prize ribbon on the English porcelain stagecoach, as well as the two Josef figurines of fine porcelain from the 50s. The Gingerbread

kitchen clock adorned made of fine walnut and of paper dolls were the mature woman who as a child. The doll with ties adorned many a bed hand tinted pictures by known illustrator born in animals. The three glass jar, and a deer embossed



many sideboards, often oak, in the past. The collage grandmother's of now a played with the paper dolls the hand knit dress with petpillow in the 50s. The four Clarence Underwood, a well 1871, portrayed the love of pieces—a butter dish, cracker compote—are all from the

1890s era. And lastly, the large soulful photo of a boy in the World War era, most likely transported to the USA from Germany, is a reminder of love of family and the freedom enjoyed in this country. Please view and enjoy this nostalgic display

New news for Seniors

Recent Medicare news highlights a new CMS demonstration model to be tested in six states starting in 2026, a new Medicare Part D base beneficiary premium of \$38.99 for 2026, continued growth in Medicare Advantage enrollment (over half of beneficiaries in 2025), and new quality ratings for hospitals like Mayo Clinic. Also in the news are legal penalties, such as a \$290 million fine for CVS Caremark in a Medicare fraud case, and recent announcements from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and the <u>Department of Justice</u> (DOJ).
