ALL ABOUT US

Central Wyoming Senior Center was established in 1975 to provide nutritious meals, companionship, program support, and activities for the senior citizens of Natrona County. We began serving meals in a church basement and eventually moved into our current facility,

where we provided more than 29,000 meals last year. All of our programs are designed to enhance the ability of the over-60 population of Natrona County to stay active, healthy and independent by offering activities and nutritional support & services to meet their changing

needs. We were established as a 501(c)3 in 1976 to provide low cost, nutritious meals to the over-60 population of Natrona County. Many of our programs are administered by the Wyoming Department of Health Office of Healthcare Financing.

A Letter from the Desk of the President:

A big thank you goes to all of you who helped to make "A Night at the Races" a huge success. This event is an important fundraiser for us and is fun for all ages. It is our biggest event of the year.

The board and staff have been working to obtain additional funding for the Center. Costs have been rising dramatically and funding opportunities continue to diminish each year. It is critical that we seek additional funding sources. In partnership with Natrona County Meals on Wheels and Wyoming Senior Citizens, Inc., we have worked with the County Commissioners to obtain a ballot proposition to set up the Natrona County Senior Citizens Service District. This proposed District which must be approved in the primary election, would be managed by five trustees who would be elected during the general election. The proposed District would be funded with up to one mill levy. The Senior Center along with the two agencies mentioned above will be able to apply thru a grant process to obtain operating funds. It is absolutely crucial that the ballot proposition be approved in order for the Center to continue to offer lunches, activities, programs and services. Our Federal and State grants presently fund 43% of our budget. This number decreases each year. The remainder must be obtained thru donations, program income and fundraising. Income has not kept up with expenses in the last five years. For further information, please see the "Facts Regarding a Proposed Senior Citizens Service District" in this newsletter.







Number of Vitamin D receptors decreases with age



Excessive intake of vitamin D can lead to adverse effects, as like any other nutrient. Overdose of vitamin D, whether through supplements or excessive consumption of fortified foods, can result in a number of conditions including nausea, loss of appetite, constipation, weight gain, weakness, and even kidney damage.

The general guideline is to avoid taking more than 4000 IU (International Units) of vitamin D per day, considering the combined intake from all the sources, such as sun exposure, food sources, and supplements.



Facts regarding a Proposed Senior Citizens Services District

There will be a ballot proposition in the primary election to create the proposed Natrona County Senior Citizen Service District (NCSCSD). Voters will vote **Yes** or **No** to create the District. The District will be governed by §18-15-101 through §18-15-111. Below are facts regarding the proposed district.

- The boundary of the District will be Natrona County.
- NCSCSD will be funded with a *maximum* of 1 (one) mill levy to be imposed on the taxable property of Natrona County. (State Statute allows up to 2 mills.)
- One mill will generate approximately \$1.7 million annually for the NCSCSD. (For a \$200,000 home, the increased property tax of 1 mill will be approximately \$1.58/month or \$19/year.)
- ❖ NCSCSD will operate independently of any other agency.
- ❖ If the District is approved in the primary election, five Trustees would be voted upon in the general election and will serve without compensation.
- ❖ The District Trustees handling funds will be bonded per §18-15-108.
- ❖ NCSCSD would provide funding for programs/services from Central Wyoming Senior Services, Inc (CWSS), Natrona County Meals on Wheels, and Wyoming Senior Citizens, Inc (WSCI). Additional programs/services may be added if they meet qualifications for senior services through §18-15-111.
- Funding may be provided to the three agencies listed above through a grant process administered by these elected NCSCSD trustees.
- ❖ Audits will be conducted annually.
- ❖ If the District is approved in the primary election, the proposition to impose a levy in the same or a different amount not to exceed 2 (two) mills must be on the ballot again in 2 years and again every 4 (four) years thereafter unless defeated.
- * There are currently **9** (nine) Senior Citizens Service Districts in Wyoming. (See p. 15) They are governed by State Statutes, Policies, Procedures, and Bylaws. Testimonials say the agencies receiving funding would not exist without the mill levy.

Why do we need this proposition on the ballot?

- ⇒ Expenses are increasing dramatically and there are decreasing opportunities for funding.
- ⇒ Income has not kept up with expenses for the last 5 years for all three agencies. Cash reserves have been used to bridge the gap, but are nearing exhaustion. *Cash reserves available for the Senior Center will cover approximately one year of operations.*
- ⇒ Federal and State funding for CWSS currently covers less than 43% of the budget. Every year this percentage decreases. The remainder must be funded by private grants, donations, program income, and fundraising. Many of these funding opportunities are diminishing.
- ⇒ For CWSS: the average cost of a meal is approximately \$16.00. Federal and State grant reimbursement is \$5.15. The Senior Center served 32,018 meals last fiscal year.
- ⇒ CWSS provided 5,020 hours of In-Home Services to 115 clients in FY23.
- ⇒ Meals on Wheels used 480 volunteers who drove 53,275 miles in FY23, valued at approximately \$3.5 million at the IRS rate.
- ⇒ WSCI advocated for 1,289 long term care residents and provided more than 2,000 hours of Medicare assistance and fraud awareness education.
- ⇒ The senior population aged 65 and older is projected to increase 47% from 2022 to 2050 (Population Reference Bureau).
- ⇒ Estimates suggest that 1 in 5 residents of Wyoming will be older than 65 by 2030.
- ⇒ One in four older residents in Wyoming live alone.
