Charge into Fire Safety: Lithium-Ion Battery Tips

- Buy smart: Choose only listed products with a nationally recognized testing lab stamp.
- Charge safely:
 - Use manufacturer-approved cables and chargers.
 - Charge on a hard surface, not on beds, pillows, or couches.
 - Unplug once fully charged—don't overcharge.
- Dispose responsibly: Never throw batteries in the trash; recycle them at safe drop-off sites via www.call2recycle.org.
