

ORDINANCE NO. 152

ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ANY PERSON FROM KEEPING MORE THAN 25 POUNDS OF GUN POWDER, GUN COTTON OR VITRIOL OR FIRE PRODUCING CHEMICAL IN GREATER QUANTITIES THAN 25 POUNDS, PROVIDING FOR CONTAINERS THEREFORE AND FOR THE PROHIBITION OF NITRO-GLYCERINE OR ANY OTHER HIGH EXPLOSIVE, AND PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING.

Section 1. No person shall keep in his place of business, or elsewhere, in the Town of Mills, Wyoming, any gun powder, gun cotton or vitriol or fire producing chemical in greater quantity than 25 pounds at any time and the same shall be kept in tin or copper canisters or cases, containing, not to exceed 25 pounds in each and in a situation remote from fires and open flames of all types and from which they may be easily removed in case of fire. No person shall be allowed to keep nitro-glycerine or any other high explosive within the Town limits of the Town of Mills, Wyoming.

Section 2. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined in an amount not exceeding \$100.00.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and become in force from and after its being posted for a period of ten days as required by law.
