ELECTRICAL WIRING

## ORDINANCE NUMBER SEVENTEEN. ELECTRICAL RULES.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Town Council of the Town of Mills,
State of Wyoming:
Electrical Rules and Permits.

Sec.1. All electrical construction, material, and apparatus shall be in conformity with the rules and requirements set forth in what is known as "The National Code" or Underwriters Rules and Regulations.

All persons, firms and corporations, save any public telephone, telegraph, messenger call, or electric light or power company,
holding a franchise from the town, who desire to have electric wiring,
fixtures, apparatus or appliances installed in or on any building in
this town, other than station or substation owned or operated by any
of the above named excepted licenses, shall secure a permit therefor
from the Town Clerk; such permits shall be issued upon application in
writing, and upon payment of fees herein provided.

It shall be unlawful for any person or corporation to connect electric current with, or use any electric wiring, fixtures,
signs, appliances or apparatus installed in or on any building in this
Town, until the same shall have been imprected and a certificate of
approval issued therefor by the Inspector.
Appointment of Inspector.

Sec.2. The Town Council shall appoint some suitable and competent person as an inspector of all electric wiring and construction placed within the limits of said town.

Notify Inspector.

Sec.3. Upon the completion of the wiring of any building it shall be the duty of the person, firm or corporation doing the work, to notify the electrical inspector and said inspector shall examine such wiring and if the same be approved by him, he shall advise

the clerk, who shall issue a certificate of approval, and the person requesting such certificate shall pay for the inspection and the issuance of such certificate.

Licenses.

Sec.4. Every person, firm or corporation wishing to engage in the business of placing, repairing, installing or operating electric wires, fixtures, appliances or apparatus in or on any buildings in the town, shall first obtain a license therefor from the Town Clerk. The license fee shall be \$15.00 per annum.

Bond.

Sec. 5. No license shall be issued until the applicant shall have entered into a bond to the Town in the sum of \$500.00 with sufficient sureties to be approved by the Council, conditioned to comply with the Town ordinances and all valid instructions of the Town Clerk. Examination.

sec.6. Such license may be granted by the Town Clerk after an examination had of the applicants as to the proficiency in such work.

Term of license.

Sec. 7. All such licenses shall expire on the first day of April each year, unless sooner revoked by the Council for noncompliance with municipal regulations and are not transferrable.

Disconnecting service.

Sec.8. The Town Inspector is authorized to have service disconnected from such wiring installation in or on buildings, and in or on streets or alleys, as may be in his judgment, hazardous to property or life, such wiring not to be again connected with service

until brought into accordance with the requirements of this ordinance.
Old wiring.

Sec. 9. The Town Inspector may in his discretion, notify owners of wires to have them removed and have wiring done in accordance with this ordinance, within 30 days from date of such notification.

Moving Picture Machines.

Sec. 10. All moving picture machines shall be constructed, installed and enclosed in a fire-proof booth, and all wiring shall be in strict accordance with the requirements of "The National Code" or Underwriters Rules and Regulations. Booths at present enclosing such moving picture machines, shall, within 30 days from the date of the passage of this ordinance, be brought to strict conformity therewith.
