ORDINANCE NO. 177

A BILL for an ordinance prohibiting vagrancy.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, NATRONA COUNTY, WYOMING.

- SECTION 1. No person shall be a vagrant. The following persons found within the Town of Mills shall be deemed guilty of vagrancy:
- a. Every person able to support himself in any respectable occupation, is without visible means of support, and living an immoral or worthless life.
 - b. Every person who solicits alms.
- c. Every person whose only visible means of support is by ownership or control of, or participation in, unlawful gambling games or other unlawful business or activity.
- d. Every person who is found wandering aimlessly
 about the Town without lawful purpose and without any visible means
 of support, or who is unable to give a satisfactory account of himself
 or a satisfactory explanation of his presence in the Town.

SECTION 2. Any person guilty of violating the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be punished as provided in Section 1.01.110 of the Mills Municipal Code.
