ORDINANCE NUMBER TWENTY-EIGHT.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING UNTO BOLTON OIL COMPANY, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE RIGHT AND PRIVILEGE TO LAY, CONSTRUCT, MAINTAIN, AND OPERATE IN CERTAIN OF THE PUBLIC STREETS AND PUBLIC WAYS OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING, A PIPE LINE FOR THE CONVEYANCE AND TRANSMISSION OF PETROLEUM.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Mills;

Sec.1. POWER AND PERMISSION GRANTED: That permission and authority is hereby granted to the Bolton Oil Company, a corporation, its successors and assigns, to lay, bury, construct, maintain, repair, operate, and remove if the same be necessary, a pipe line or pipe lines for the conveyance and transmission of petroleum, through a certain portion of Northwestern Avenue, Town of Mills, and to operate and maintain a telegraph line in connection therewith.

Sec.2. ALL LINES TO BE BURIED: All such pipe lines as the said Bolton Oil Company, its successors or assigns, may now or hereafter construct, shall be a proper, safe, and good quality of material for the purpose for which same are to be used and shall be buried, placed and laid below the surface to a sufficient depth, in a good and workmanlike manner.

Sec.3. LAYING PIPES NEAR WATER OR SEWER MAINS: No pipes or mains for the transmission of petroleum shall be laid nearer than two (20) feet from any water main, except where such pipe or mains cross each other, nor shall the laying of the pipe line herein referred to, interfere with any public improvement in said streets or public ways, but the said Bolton Oil Company, its successors and assigns, shall have the right to extend, where the same may be necessary, said pipe line across any and all sewers.

Sec.4. SHALL FILE MAP: Said Bolton Oil Company shall file a map showing all lines, sizes and locations thereon, with the City Engineer or Council.

Sec.5. GRADE LINES: No fixtures or appliances, except telegraph lines, shall extend above the grade line of any street, lane or public way, where the same may be situated.

Retained as record only

Sec.6. RESTORING STREETS TO GOOD CONDITION: The opening of any and all streets or public ways by the grantee herein, its agents or employees, and the laying and erecting by them of any and all pipe lines or other fixtures and appliances, under and by virtue of this Ordinance, shall at all times be subject to the inspection of the Town of Mills, and any street or public way, opened under and pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be restored within a reasonable time thereafter to as good condition as it was in before such opening was made, as nearly as may be, and to a condition satisfactory to the City Engineer of the Town of Mills, and when same has been restored to such condition, said Bolton Oil Company will not be responsible for keeping said streets or public ways in such condition.

Sec.7; CONTRACT: The Mayor and City Clerk are hereby authorized to enter into a contract pursuant to the conditions of this ordinance.

THIS ORDINANCE was passed on the 6th day of November, 1922, and shall take effect and become in full force after the same has been posted ten days, as is provided by Statute.
