

ORDNANCE NO. 43

An ordinance prescribing the duties of Police Judge of the Town of Mills, Wyoming and prescribing fees to be received by Police Judge and Marshall of the Town of Mills, Wyoming.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOW OF MILLS,
WYOMING:

Sec. 1. That it shall be the duty of the Police Judge of the Town of Mills to hear, try, and determine all offenses as prescribed and outlined by the ordinances of the Town of Mills Wyoming, on complaint under oath, saving the defendant the right to appeal to the District Court of Natrona County Wyoming.

Sec. 2. That all criminal actions for the violation of an ordinance of the Town of Mills Wyoming must be begun by a complaint filed with the police judge of said town. Whenever a complaint shall be in writing upon oath, signed by complainant and filed with the police judge charging any person with the commission of a crime under the ordinances or an ordinance of the Town of Mills it shall be the duty of the police judge to issue a warrant shall be directed to the Town Marshall, who shall serve the same by arresting the defendant if in his power, and bringing him without unnecessary delay before the police judge.

Sec. 3. That it shall be the duty of the police judge to hear, try, and determine all cases of violations of ordinances of the Town of Mills Wyoming, after complaints have been made and warrants issued in the manner set out in section 2 of this ordinance, and to render judgement after having heard the evidence in the case, in accordance with the penalty provided by ordinance, when defendant is adjudged guilty.

Sec. 4. That the police justice shall remit all fines and forfeitures collected by him to the Town Treasurer, on or before the first day of the month immediately following the collection of such fines and forfeitures.

Sec. 5. That the fees of the police judge and marshall shall be the same as prescribed by the Wyoming Compiled Statute of 1920 for justice of the peace and constables.

Sec. 6. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten days after the passage and publication of the same.
