

ORDINANCE NUMBER 44

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE TAKING UP, IMPOUNDING AND SELLING OF ESTRAYS
BY THE MARSHAL OF THE TOWN OF MILLS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING:

Sec. 1. That it shall be the Duty of the Town Marshal of the Town of Mills, Wyoming to take up and impound any live stock, cattle, horses, mules, donkeys, or other Domestic Animals found running at large in the Town of Mills, and it shall be the duty of the Marshal to impound such animals in the place used as the Town Pound, until the owner of such animals shall have paid all damage done by said animal and all costs incurred in the impounding and caring for such animals.

Sec. 2. That if the owner of said animal or animals shall have failed to appear and claim said animal or animals within five days after the impounding of same, the Town Marshal of the Town of MILLS shall advertise said animal or animals for sale in some newspaper published in the Town of Mills, or if there be no paper published in the Town of Mills in some newspaper published in Natrona County, said publication to be for a period of ten days before sale and may be perfected by one publication in such newspaper, at which sale such animal or animals shall be sold to the highest and best bidder for cash and the proceeds shall be applied first to the costs of impounding and feeding such animals, and the residue, if any shall be placed in the Town Treasury of the Town of Mills.

Sec. 3. That this Ordinance shall be in force and effect ten days after the passage and publication of this ordinance.
