

ORDINANCE NO. 466

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 459
PERTAINING TO THE BUDGET OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING has obtained approval from the Union Pacific Railroad to remove the existing railroad crossing in the vicinity of First Street and Northwestern Avenue in the Town of Mills, Wyoming.

WHEREAS the public health, safety and welfare will be served by the immediate removal of the railroad crossing.

WHEREAS Ordinance No. 459 pertaining to the budget of the Town of Mills, Wyoming should immediately be amended to provide for the availability of funds for the construction costs incurred in the demolition of the railroad crossing and construction of an improved roadway.

WHEREAS the Town of Mills, Wyoming has undertaken a project to construct pedestrian sidewalks along portions of Pendell Boulevard within the Town of Mills, Wyoming, and WHEREAS the construction costs as previously budgeted by the Town of Mills, Wyoming, are insufficient to complete said project, and WHEREAS the completion of said project will serve the public health, safety and welfare.

WHEREAS the Town of Mills, Wyoming has undertaken a project to construct a park known as Freden Park within the Town of Mills, Wyoming, and WHEREAS the construction costs as previously budgeted by the Town of Mills, Wyoming, are insufficient to complete said project, and WHEREAS monies have been pledged by a third party entity to the Town of Mills, Wyoming for the construction of the gazebo in Freden Park, and WHEREAS the Town of Mills, Wyoming must obtain matching funds for the construction costs for the gazebo and additional funding to complete Phase Two of the project.

WHEREAS the Town of Mills, Wyoming is desirous of paving portions of Marmon street, a potential logical, feasible and natural extension of the Town of Mills, Wyoming, and whereas the Town must appropriate funds for the construction costs of the paving.

WHEREAS the geography and climate of the Town of Mills, Wyoming provides a limited construction season for the completion of said projects, and WHEREAS the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety or welfare of the residents would be served by the immediate appropriation of funds necessary for said projects.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING:

SECTION 1:

Ordinance No. 459 pertaining to the Budget of the Town of Mills, Wyoming is hereby amended to provide additional funding into the Town of Mills, Wyoming Street Department in the amount of \$86,350.00 for the demolition of the railroad crossing and completion of an improved roadway in the vicinity of First Street and Northwestern Avenue in the Town of Mills, Wyoming.

SECTION 2:

Ordinance No. 459 pertaining to the Budget of the Town of Mills, Wyoming is hereby amended to provide additional funding into the Town of Mills, Wyoming Street Department in the amount of \$5,500.00 for the completion of the sidewalks along portions of Pendell Boulevard within the Town of Mills, Wyoming.

SECTION 3:

Ordinance No. 459 pertaining to the Budget of the Town of Mills, Wyoming is hereby amended to provide additional funding into the Town of Mills, Wyoming Parks Department in the amount of \$20,000.00 to provide additional construction costs for Phase Two and provide matching funds for the construction of the gazebo in Freden Park within the Town of Mills, Wyoming.

SECTION 4:

Ordinance No. 459 pertaining to the Budget of the Town of Mills, Wyoming is hereby amended to provide additional funding into the Town of Mills, Wyoming General Fund in the amount of \$23,000.00 for the paving of certain portions of Marmon street.

SECTION 5:

IT IS FURTHER ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING that the funding source for the budget increase authorized herein shall be any unencumbered surplus funds from the Town of Mills Reserve Fund Account.

SECTION 5:

Pursuant to W.S. §15-1-115(c) for an emergency Ordinance, the requirements relating to public readings and the ten (10) day elapse between introduction and passage may be suspended by the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the qualified members of the governing body; and, pursuant to W.S. §15-1-115(d), the passage of an emergency Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the qualified members of the governing body.

SECTION 6:

Pursuant to W.S. §15-1-105(a)(iii), an emergency Ordinance means an Ordinance operating for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety or welfare, in which the emergency is defined.

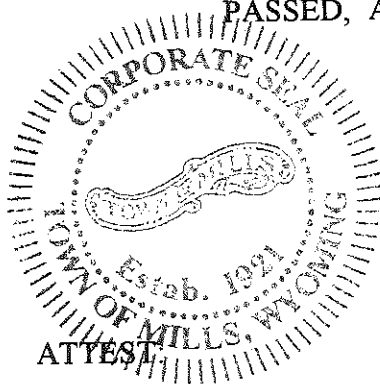
SECTION 7:

For the reasons set forth in the preamble of this Ordinance, the Council finds and declares that an emergency exists; that this Ordinance is for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare, and that it shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its approval.
