## ORDINANCE NUMBER 48A

PROVIDING FOR THE AMENDMENT OF ORDINANCE NUMBER FORTY-EIGHT, WHICH IS AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION, PROHIBITION AND LICENSE OF THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC AND MALT LIQUOR.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING:

SECTION I.--AMENDING ORDINATE NUMBER FORTY-EIGHT. That Ordinance Number Forty-eight, which is an ordinance Providing for the Regulation, Prohibition and License of the Sala of Alcoholic and Malt Liquor, shall Be, and Is, hereby Amended in the extent that Section Seven of said Ordinance Number Forty-eight shall hereafter Read as Follows; SECTION 7.--Every Person Licensed under the Provisions of this Ordinance as a Retail Liquor Dealer, shall pay Annually for a License hereunder the Sum of Five Hundred Dollars, and that said License Fee shall be Paid in Full to the Town Treasurer before the Issuance of Any License for the Retail Sale of Alcoholic Liquor within the Town of MILLS.

SECTION 2. -- REMAINDER OF ORDINANCE NUMBER FORTY\_EIGHT TO STAND UNALTERED.

That Ordinance N mber Forty-eight shall Remain as Written, Except for the Amendment herein Specified.

SECTION 3. -- THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND BE IN FORCE AFTER TEN DAYS FROM DATE.
