Chapter 2.04

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2.04.010 OF THE TOWN OF MILLS MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO TIME AND PLACE OF COUNCIL MEETINGS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS it is necessary to provide a procedure to hold the regular meetings of the Mills Town Council on an alternate date in cases where the Mayor or other council members cannot attend the regular meetings, and

WHEREAS an emergency exists because the mayor and/or other council members are unable to attend the regularly scheduled meeting of the Town Council on July 9, 2003, and the adoption of an emergency ordinance providing for a procedure to reschedule the regular meeting is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING SECTION 2.04.010 OF THE MILLS MUNICIPAL CODE IS HEREBY AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1:

2.04.010 Time and place of meetings. Regular meetings of the town council shall be held on the first Wednesday of each month, unless the first Wednesday falls upon the first or second day of the month, in which event the regular meeting shall be held on the second Wednesday of the month. Regular meetings shall commence at seven-thirty (7:30) p.m. and be held at the council chambers, 704 4th Street or at any other place designated according to law. (Ord. 216 §1, 1973; Ord. 166 §1, 1966.)

In the event the Mayor or a quorum of Council members shall be unable to attend the regular meeting of the Town Council due to illness, scheduling conflicts or any other reason, the Council may elect to hold its regular meeting at another date and time as determined by the Council. In the event any regular meeting of the Town Council is rescheduled as provided herein, the Town Clerk shall cause a notice of the date and time of such meeting to be published in a newspaper of general circulation at least fifteen (15) days before the date of the rescheduled meeting and shall post a notice of the rescheduled meeting in the Town Hall at least fifteen (15) days before the date of the rescheduled meeting.

SECTION 2:

Pursuant to W.S. §15-1-115(c) for an emergency Ordinance, the requirements relating to public readings and the ten (10) day elapse between introduction and passage may be suspended by the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the qualified members of the governing body; and, pursuant to W.S. §15-1-115(d), the passage of an emergency Ordinance requires the affirmative vote of three-fourths (3/4) of the qualified members of the governing body.

SECTION 3:

Pursuant to W.S. §15-1-105(a)(iii), an emergency Ordinance means an Ordinance operating for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety or welfare, in which the emergency is defined.

SECTION 4:

For the reasons set forth in the preamble of this Ordinance, the Council finds and declares that an emergency exists; that this Ordinance is for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare, and that it shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its approval.
