

SECTION TEN - POUND MASTER

SUBSECTION 6.-- REMUNERATION. That unless and until otherwise provided by Ordinance of the Town Council, the Town Pound Master shall receive no salary for his services to the town of Mills in this official capacity, but he shall be entitled to retain one half of all collected Pound Fees remaining after deduction of all costs of feeding and caring for impounded animals, as provided in Part One of Ordinance Number Forty-six A, as rightful payment for services by him rendered unto the town of Mills; provided that all Pound Fees, other than those expended for feeding and caring for impounded animals and the portion retained by the Pound Master as herein provided, shall be remitted to the Town Treasurer and covered into the Town Treasury as provided by law, and that a report of all receipts of such pound fees, expenditures of the same or of any part thereof, and the amount of money retained by the Pound Master as his portion thereof, shall be made regularly by the Pound Master to the Town Treasurer and to the Town Council.

SECTION ELEVEN - POLICE JUSTICE; APPOINTMENT, QUALIFICATIONS, JURISDICTION, AUTHORITY, DUTIES, TERM OF OFFICE, REMOVAL FROM OFFICE, REMUNERATION, ABSENCE.

SUBSECTION 1.-- APPOINTMENT, QUALIFICATION, TERM OF OFFICE, DUTIES, JURISDICTION, REMOVAL FROM OFFICE, REMUNERATION. That the Police Justice of the town of Mills shall be appointed in the manner and for such period of time as established in Section One, subsection 1, of this Ordinance, subject to such provisions and regulations applicable to his Office as therein contained, and to removal from Office as provided in Section Two, Subsection 3, and in Section Three, subsection 4, of this Ordinance; that he shall qualify for his Office as provided in Section One, Subsection 2, of this Ordinance, in addition to which he shall be required to execute a Bond to the people of the town of Mills, with sureties acceptable to the Town Council, conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties of his Office in accordance with law and with the Ordinances of the town of Mills, and that he will turn over to the parties ~~mentioned~~ entitled

thereto, as prescribed by the Ordinances of the Town, all moneys collected by him by virtue of his Office as Police Justice, and all books and records of his Office, in a sum of not less than Five Hundred (\$500.00) dollars, and to file such Bond with the Town Clerk; that he shall have such rights, authority and jurisdiction as provided by the laws of the ~~xxxx~~ state of Wyoming and by the Ordinances of the town of Mills, and shall perform such duties for the Town as established by this and other Ordinances of the Town Council thereof; and that the Police Justice shall receive a salary of Sixty (\$60.00) dollars per annum, to be paid out of the general fund of the Town, in twelve equal monthly installments of Five (\$5.00) dollars each.

SUBSECTION 2.-- JURISDICTION, ISSUE PROCESS, COMPEL ATTENDANCE - PUNISH FOR CONTEMPT.

That the Police Justice shall be the conservator of the peace and that he shall have exclusive jurisdiction over, and it shall be his duty to hear and determine all cases arising from any breach of the Ordinances of the Town, or from any alleged breach of such Ordinances, committed within the corporate limits of the said Town; but in any case in which property damage is involved, his court shall entertain such suit only in so far as the offense committed constitutes a breach of the said Ordinances of the Town; that he shall have authority to issue warrants, search warrants and subpoenas and attachments to coerce the attendance of witnesses, and to compel any witness to be sworn in some manner prescribed by law and to answer all pertinent and proper questions; and that he shall have power to enforce due obedience to all orders, rules and judgements made by him, and to punish for contempt any person, or persons, guilty of resistance to, or disobedience of, any lawful order or process made or issued by him; or guilty of making any unnecessary noise or disturbance, or other breach of the peace, or of disorderly, contemptuous or insolent conduct toward him whilst engaged in the trial of any cause, or in rendering judgement, or in any judicial proceedings, which tends to interrupt such proceedings or to impair the respect due to his authority;
