ORDINANCE NUMBER FIFTY-TWO - A AUTHORIZING AND EMPOWERING THE MAYOR OF THE TOWN OF MILLS TO APPOINT SPECIAL POLICE OFFICERS TO ASSIST THE TOWN MARSHAL IN THE PRESERVA-TION OF THE PEACE AND THE ENFORCEMENT OF THE LAWS OF THE TOWN OF MILLS: PROVIDING FOR THE RENUMERATION OF SUCH OFFICERS, THEIR TERMS OF OFFICE AND PROVIDING FOR THEIR PERFORMANCE OF SUCH DUTIES AS MAY BE DIRECTED BY THE MAYOR; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO MAKE APPOINTMENTS OF SUCH OFFICERS, IN EMERGENCIES, WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THE TOWN COUNCIL. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILLS. WYOMING: SECTION 1. -- APPOINTMENT? DUTY, TERM OF OFFICE AND RENUMERATION OF SPECIAL POLICE OFFICERS. That the Mayor of the town of Mills is hereby authorized and empowered with the advice and consents of the Town Council, to appoint one or more special police officers to aid and x assist the Town Marshal in preserving the peace and enforcing the laws of the Town of Mills; such special police officers to hold office during the pleasure of the said Mayor, to perform such services for the town as directed by the said Mayor, and to receive no regular salary for the performance of such services, unless in special case the Town Council shall vote to pay any such officer any sum, not exceding Twenty-five dollars in any one month, for any special service performed during that time by the said officer; provided that the said special police officers shall be under the direction of the Mayor only and answerable only to the said Mayor for their official conduct. SECTION 2 .-- MAYOR MAY APPOINT SPECIAL POLICE WITHOUT CONSENT OF COUNCIL IN EMERGENCIES AND IN FAILURE OF THE COUNCIL TO CONFIRM APPOINTMENTS. That in the event of any emergency, wherein the life, health, morals, welfare or property of any resident or residents of the town of Milas are endangered or impaired, or in the refusal or failure of the Town Council to confirm an appointment of a special police officer, when such appointment is deemed to be necessary or of advantage to the town of Mills, the Mayor shall have authority and it is hereby made his duty to make such an appointment without the consent of the council; provided that any such appointment made by the Mayor in an emergency as herein Or. 52-A Pg. 1

Council if possible, but failure of the Council to confirm shall not invalidate the said appointment.

THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND BECOME IN FORCE AS A LWW OF THE TOWN OF MILLS FOLLOWING ITS POSTING IN THREE PUBLIC PLACES FOR A PERIOD OF TEN DAYS AS REQUIRED BY LAW.
