

Ordinance No. 635

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO 264, APPEARING IN THE MILLS MUNICIPAL CODE AS SECTION 10.36.020 ENTITLED "STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING PROHIBITED IN SPECIFIC PLACES" AMENDING SUCH ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT PARKING A VEHICLE IN A PARKWAY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING:

That section 10.36.020 of the Mills Municipal Code and Ordinance 264 of the Town of Mills is hereby amended to read as follows:

CHAPTER 10.36

STOPPING, STANDING AND PARKING

10.36.020 Stopping, standing, or parking prohibited in specific places.

- (a) No person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle, except, when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or traffic-control device, in any of the following places:
- (1) On a sidewalk;
 - (2) In front of a public or private driveway;
 - (3) Within an intersection; or cross walk;
 - (4) At any place where official signs prohibit stopping;
 - (5) Within fifteen (15) feet of fire hydrants;
 - (6) On any bridge or elevated structure upon a highway;
 - (7) On any railroad tracks or within fifty (50) feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing;
 - (8) In the area between roadways of a divided highway, including crossovers;
 - (9) Within twenty (20) feet of the driveway entrance to any fire station and on the side of the street opposite the entrance to any fire station within seventy-five (75) feet of the entrance;
 - (10) Within any fire lane as provided by §10.56.010.
 - (11) At any place where official traffic-control devices prohibit stopping, standing or parking;
 - (12) In a parkway.
- (b) No person shall park a motor vehicle within twenty (20) feet of an intersection or crosswalk.
- (c) No person shall move a vehicle not lawfully under his control into any prohibited area or away from a curb a distance of eighteen (18) inches from the right hand side of the vehicle. (Ord. 264 §1, 1979)

EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect ten (10) days following its passage and approval on third and final reading.

REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES

All existing Ordinances or parts of Ordinances of the Town of Mills are hereby repealed insofar as they may be inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance.

SEPERABILITY OF PROVISIONS

It is the intention of the Council that each separate provision of this Ordinance be deemed independent of all other provisions, and it is further the intention of the Council that if any provisions of this Ordinance be declared invalid for any reason that all other provisions hereof shall remain valid and enforceable.

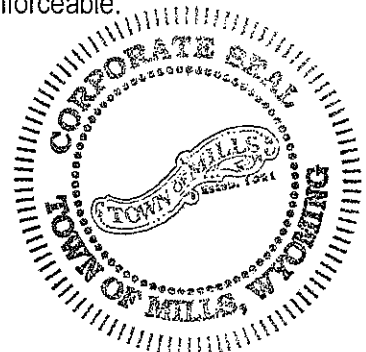
