ORDNANCE FOR CONTROLLING THE COTTAGE HARBOR DISTRICT, FOR THE
PURPOSE OF MAINTAINING MORALITY, AMONG THE INHABITANTS OF ALL PUBLIC VILLAGES
(AS DEFINED IN THE STATUTE OF THE STATE OF TORONTO, NO. 51, 1862)
OPERATING WITHIN THE TOWN OF BURLIN, AND AMONG THE INHABITANTS OF ALL TOWNS
INCLUDING, EXCEPT AS AND FOR CARrying ON ANY BUSINESS WHICH
INVOLVES ONLY TRIVIAL LIQUOR DEALERS, WHICH WILL NOT INVOLVE
FOR THE PURCHASE OF AND FOR THE PURCHASING OF TRIVIAL LIQUOR DEALERS
SO AS TO ALLOW THEM TO PURCHASE AND THE OPERATION OF SUCH BUSINESS; SO AS NOT TO
PENALIZE THE VARIOUS BUSINESS HAVING OMISSIONS WHICH ARE
RIGHT, NICE, PRACTICAL, REASONABLE, FAIRLY-DO, THAT IS TO SAY, WHICH ARE
THIRTY-ONE, THIRTY-TWO, THIRTY-THREE, AND THIRTY-FOUR, AND ALL OTHER
OMISSIONS AND FAIRLY-DOES OF COTTAGE HARBOR DISTRICT WHICH ARE
NOT CONTAINED IN THE ORDNANCE FOR CONTROLLING THE COTTAGE HARBOR DISTRICT
WHICH IS AS FOLLOWS: THAT THE COTTAGE HARBOR DISTRICT, SHALL BE AND ARE
HEREBY REPEALED, CANCELLED AND DISMISSED TO HEREFORTH FROM AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE 7.—TAXES FOR DEFENSE AND PUBLIC CONVENIENCE.
Paragraph 1. The mill operator within the town of Willard, New York, or his
or her survivor or any trustee or beneficiary by power of attorney given

SECTION TEN (Continued) terms thereof, ten dollars.

SECTION 2. -- REMAINDER OF ORDINANCE NUMBER SIXTY-SEVEN TO REMAIN UNALTERED. That except as provided in the foregoing section, Ordinance number Sixty-seven shall remain unaltered and in force as a legal ordinance of the town of Mills.

SECTION 3. -- ORDINANCE NOT TO BE INVALIDATED BY ANY PART DECLARED UNCONSTITUTIONAL. That if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason, declared unconstitutional or in violation of the statutes of the state of Wyoming, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this ordinance, which shall continue in force the same as though no deletion had been made.

SECTION 4. -- THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND BE IN FORCE APPROXIMATELY BEING POSTED FOR A PERIOD OF TEN DAYS AS REQUIRED BY LAW.
