

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO A VOTE OF THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, AT A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD IN SAID TOWN ON AUGUST 19, 1952, THE QUESTION OF AUTHORIZING SAID TOWN TO BORROW MONEY AND ISSUE ITS SEWER REVENUE BONDS IN AN AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING \$145,000 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE COST OF CONSTRUCTING A SEWERAGE SYSTEM FOR SAID TOWN AND ITS INHABITANTS.

WHEREAS, the Town of Mills, Wyoming, does not have a proper or adequate sewerage system; and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Town Council it is necessary to construct a sewerage system for said town and its inhabitants, such system to consist of mains, laterals, a sewage disposal plant and necessary appurtenances; and

WHEREAS, the Town does not have in its treasury available funds which may be used for said purpose, which fact makes it necessary to submit to the qualified electors of the Town the question of incurring indebtedness and issuing bonds for said purpose;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING:

Section 1. That at a special election of the qualified electors of the said Town of Mills in the County of Natrona, and State of Wyoming, to be held on Tuesday, the 19th day of August, A.D. 1952, there shall be, and there is hereby submitted to the qualified electors of said Town the question and proposition stated in the form of ballot and proclamation hereinafter set forth.

Section 2. That the question and proposition so submitted shall be voted on at said election by the voters qualified by law at Mills School Building in said Town.

Section 3. Said election shall be held and conducted and the vote canvassed and returned and the result declared in the manner prescribed by law for other Town elections. On the day of said election, the voting place shall be opened at nine o'clock in the morning and it shall be kept open without any adjournment until seven o'clock in the evening, at which time the voting place shall be closed.

Section 4. At said election there shall be provided two ballot boxes at the polling place, one to be designated Ballot Box "A" and the other Ballot Box "B". There shall also be

provided two sets of ballots, one of which shall be printed on white paper and the other on colored paper, both of which shall contain the same statement of the proposal to be voted upon and the same instructions respecting the manner of marking the ballot.

Every citizen of the United States of the age of twenty-one (21) years and upwards, who has resided in the State of Wyoming one year and in the said Town of Mills sixty days next preceding said election and who has complied with the registration laws, shall be entitled to vote thereat. If such elector is not the owner of or the spouse of the owner of real or personal property assessed on the assessment roll of the said Town, he shall be furnished by the officers conducting said election, a ballot printed on white paper and the ballots of all such persons shall be deposited in Ballot Box "A".

If such elector is the owner of or the spouse of the owner of real or personal property assessed on the assessment rolls of said Town, he shall be furnished by such officers a ballot printed on colored paper and the ballots of all such persons shall be deposited in Ballot Box "B".

Before any person shall be permitted to vote a ballot printed on colored paper, he or she shall be required to make before the officers of election, an affidavit showing that he or she is the owner of or the spouse of the owner of real or personal property assessed on the assessment rolls of said Town.

Section 5. The official ballots shall contain and set forth the following proposition:

Section 6. Each person offering to vote on said election day who possesses proper qualifications and who is not officially registered shall take and subscribe the same oath as is required by law of persons applying to be registered. Such affidavit shall be administered by one of the judges of election without charge, and it shall be returned by the judges with the poll lists. Upon registering as provided herein, such person shall be entitled to vote at said election.

Section 7. The Mayor and the Town Clerk are hereby directed and authorized to make a proclamation, not more than 30 days and not less than 15 days before said special election herein provided for, a copy of which shall be published in the official newspaper of said Town, to-wit: The Casper Tribune-Herald, setting forth the fact that on the 19th day of August, A.D. 1952, at said special election, there shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the Town the question and proposition hereinbefore set forth. Such proclamation shall be signed by the Mayor and attested by the Clerk of the Town of Mills, Wyoming, and shall be in substantially the following form:

Every citizen of the United States of the age of twenty-one (21) years and upwards, who has resided in the State of Wyoming one year and in the Town of Mills, Wyoming, sixty days next preceding said election, and who has complied with the registration laws, shall be entitled to vote thereat. If such elector is not the owner of or the spouse of the owner of real or personal property assessed on the assessment rolls of the said Town, he shall be furnished by the officers conducting said election a ballot printed on white paper, and the ballots of all such persons shall be deposited in Ballot Box "A."

If such elector is the owner of or the spouse of the owner of real or personal property assessed on the assessment rolls of said town, he shall be furnished by such officers a ballot printed on colored paper, and the ballots of all such persons shall be deposited in Ballot Box "B".

Before any person shall be permitted to vote a ballot printed on colored paper, he or she shall be required to make before the officers of election an affidavit showing that he or she is the owner of or the spouse of the owner of real or personal property assessed on the assessment rolls of said Town.

Each person offering to vote on said election day who possesses proper qualifications and who is not officially registered shall take and subscribe the same oath as is required by law of persons applying to be registered. Such affidavit shall be administered by one of the judges of election without charge, and it shall be returned by the judges with the poll lists. Upon registering as provided herein, such person shall be entitled to vote at said election.



Section 9. In the event that the proposal to issue said revenue bonds is carried at said election, the Town Council will adopt a supplemental ordinance setting forth the terms and conditions under which said bonds shall be issued.

Section 10. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 11. Because of the fact that the Town is not properly or adequately supplied with sewer facilities, the Town Council finds and declares that an emergency exists; that this Ordinance is for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety and shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Every citizen of the United States of the age of twenty-one (21) years and upwards, who has resided in the State of Wyoming and voted in the said Town of Wyo in either days next preceding said election and who has complied with the registration laws, shall be entitled to vote therewith. If such elector is not the owner of or the spouse of the owner of real or personal property assessed on the assessment roll of the said Town, he shall be furnished by the officers conducting said election, a ballot printed on white paper and the ballots of all such persons shall be deposited in Ballot Box A.

The fourth election shall be held on the second of the month of April for general property assessed on the assessment roll of said Town, and shall be conducted by such officers a ballot printed on colored paper and the ballots of all such persons

At said election there shall be provided two ballot boxes at the polling place, one to be designated Ballot Box "A," and the other Ballot Box "B." There shall also be provided two sets of ballots, one of which shall be printed on white paper and the other on colored paper, both of which shall contain the same statement of the several truths, tested upon and the same instructions respecting the manner of marking the ballot.

Persons sixteen years of age or older, who have resided in the State of Wyoming one year and three months preceding the election, and who have complied with the registration laws, shall be entitled to vote thereat. If such elector is not the owner of or the spouse of the owner of real or personal property assessed on the assessment rolls of the said Town, he shall be furnished by the officers conducting said election a ballot printed on white paper, and the ballot of all such persons shall be deposited in Ballot Box "A."

If such elector is the owner of or the spouse of the owner of real or personal property assessed on the assessment rolls of said town, he shall be furnished by such officer a ballot printed on colored paper, and the ballot of all such persons shall be deposited in Ballot Box "B."

Each voter shall be required to present his or her voter's ballot
and shall be called upon to declare that he or she is qualified to make be-
tween the officers of said election or to exhibit showing that he or she
is the owner of or the trustee of the owner of real or personal
property assessed on the assessment rolls of said Town.

Each person offering to vote on said election day who
possesses no proper qualifications and who is not officially regis-
tered shall be given time to comply with the laws as is required by law
and shall be given time to register. Such registrant shall be ad-
mitted to the polls of said Town without charge, and
shall be issued a temporary voter's card and a poll ticket. Upon regis-
tration of such person, he or she, such person shall be entitled to vote
at said election.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE OFFICE OF BUILDING INSPECTOR FOR THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING; PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A PERSON TO FILL THE SAID OFFICE, HIS QUALIFICATION, TERM OF OFFICE, ETC., - - - -

SECTION 10.-- SEPARABILITY OF SECTION. That if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, ~~invalid~~ adjudged unconstitutional or in violation of, or in conflict with Federal law or the Statutes of the State of Wyoming, such decision shall not affect the remainder of this ordinance, but such remainder shall remain effective and shall continue in force, unimpaired by such adjudication.

SECTION 11.-- THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND BECOME IN FORCE AS A LEGAL ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF MILLS, WYOMING, FOLLOWING ITS ENACTMENT AND BEING POSTED UP FOR A PERIOD OF TEN DAYS AS REQUIRED BY LAW.




